## Choose some fun ideas to try at home

<p> <b>Read Read Read</b> Try to read every day! Keep a record of your reading in your home learning book. Any book you read is great, or get an adult to read to you. (It doesn't need to be a school book) or try <a href="http://sunshineclassics.co.nz">sunshineclassics.co.nz</a></p>	<p> <b>Fitness Fun</b> Do an outdoor activity with a family member e.g. walk, ball game, gardening</p>
<p> <b>Spelling Bee</b> Practise a new word from the word list on the school website. Write it down, say it out loud</p>	<p> <b>Act of Kindness</b> Do something to help out at home</p>
<p> <b>Autumn Fun</b> Go for a walk and collect Autumn leaves. You could do a leaf rubbing or make a leaf collage</p>	<p> Email a family member or friend Email or video chat with a family member or friend. Email them or talk to them about how you stay safe online.</p>
<p> <b>Healthy Lunch</b> Research some healthy lunch ideas. Make a healthy lunch and take a photo or draw it.</p>	<p> <b>Book Review</b> Read a book and write or tell a family member about what happened and why they should read the book.</p>
<p> <b>Shoe count</b> Count all the shoes in your house. How many do you have. Can you draw a picture or write a number sentence?</p>	<p> Build something fun with Lego. Take a photo and make up a story about what is happening.</p>
<p> Cook or bake something and take a photo or draw what you made</p>	<p> <b>Number Search</b> Go for a walk and see how many numbers you can find e.g. on houses, signs etc Extra for Experts- Add all the numbers you find and see who gets the highest total or add/take away the numbers you find to try and get to 100.</p>
<p> <b>Survey</b> Make up a question and survey 10 people by phone. Extra for Experts- Draw a tally chart of your results. What did you find out? Can you make a graph of your results?</p>	<p> <b>Language</b> Learn to say hello in a new language. You could research some facts about the country.</p>

 <b>Basic Facts</b> Practise your basic maths facts. How many ways can you make 7 e.g. $7 + 0 = 7$ , $6 + 1 = 7$ , $5 + 2 = 7$ etc Choose an appropriate number	 <b>Ask a question</b> Practise adding, multiplication and problem solving orally. Ask your child to make up questions for you too e.g. "If I had 8 apples and ate 2, how many would I have left?" "What is 2 groups of 3"
