This week we are celebrating Samoan Language week with the theme for this years celebration being **Mitamita i lau gagana, maua'a lou fa'asinomaga** (Be proud of your language and grounded in your identity). Gagana Sāmoa is the third most spoken language across the motu (land) — let's celebrate it! Uplifting Gagana Sāmoa is an act of tautua (service) that allows tamaiti / children to feel seen and represented in their culture and identity, and allows others to learn too.

Gardening Update June 2023



There have been lots of exciting developments in the school garden this year. We had our first harvest of peaches, apples, plums and feijoas last term from our new fruit trees. The peaches and feijoas were favourites. We are still waiting for our citrus plants and grapes to produce. We have also started setting up a herb area in the garden. If you have cuttings or spare seedlings to donate, please send them to Room 3.

We set up a worm farm so successfully last year that we have now set up a second worm farm. The Verandah tamariki enjoy collecting apple cores, banana skins and other food scraps to feed the worms. We love to look at the worms and see how many there are each time.

We are now using the 4 new garden beds, nearly doubling the size of the vegetable garden. We are growing lots of vegetables, including spinach and silverbeet, beetroot, broad beans, carrots, kale, leeks, spring onions and celery. We are hoping to use some of these vegetables to make soup to share at matariki.

We have enjoyed preparing and cooking vegetables from the garden to eat. The Verandah have enjoyed vegetable stir-fry from our school garden.

The Friday lunchtime gardening group meet throughout the year, weeding, planting seeds, harvesting, and setting up the worm farm. There is a small but keen group of children who have worked really hard all year in the garden area.


Drawing on skin and tattoo transfers are not acceptable.


